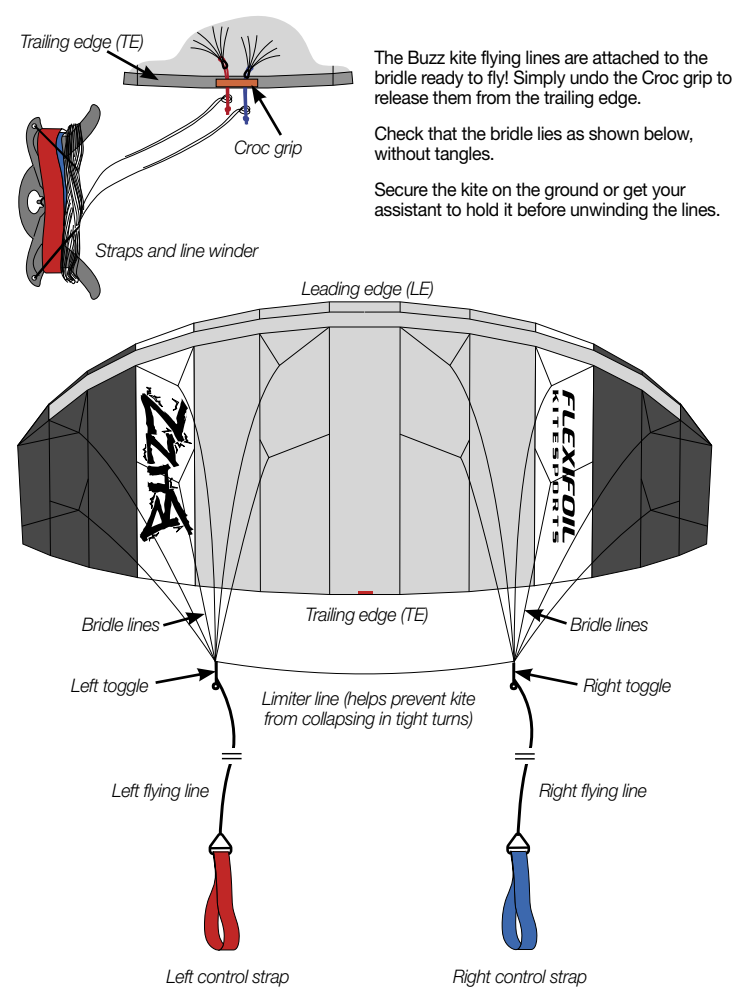


Buzz Kite Overview



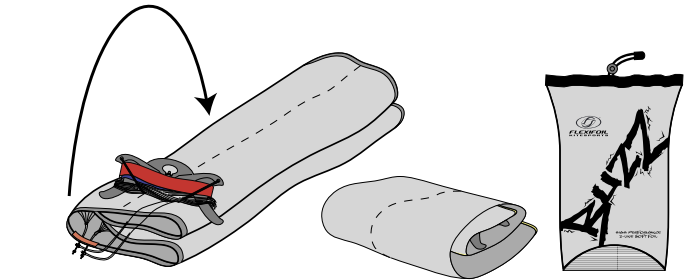
The Buzz kite flying lines are attached to the bridle ready to fly! Simply undo the Croc grip to release them from the trailing edge.

Check that the bridle lies as shown below, without tangles.

Secure the kite on the ground or get your assistant to hold it before unwinding the lines.

Packing Away

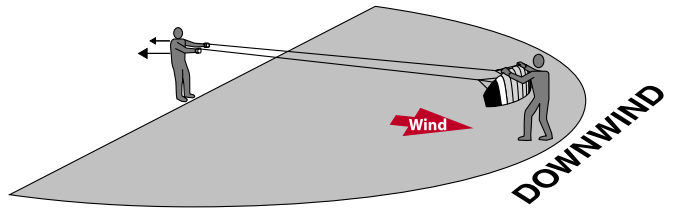
- Hook the straps onto the winder, wind up the lines in a figure 8 motion.
- Secure the lines to the winder with the elastic band, leaving the toggles free.
- Secure the toggles under the croc grip on the Buzz.
- Fold the Buzz up as shown, ensuring that the bridle lines are enclosed within the kite
- Roll the kite around the winder, so that the flying lines cannot get tangled in the bridle.
- Your Buzz bag has a wide opening to make it easy to store the kite.



Assisted Launch (Recommended for beginners)

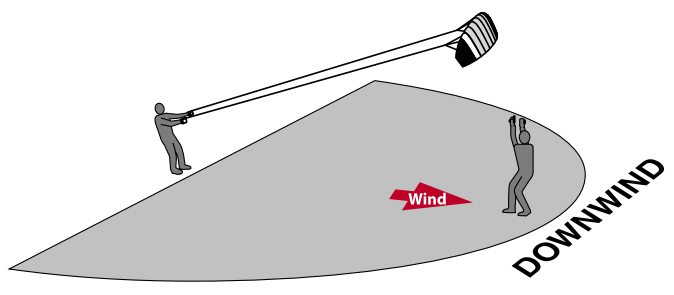
Get your assistant to hold your Buzz kite. Unwind lines and check they are separated and straight.

Ask your assistant to hold up your Buzz so it inflates.



Take up the tension on both lines and signal to your assistant to release the Buzz.

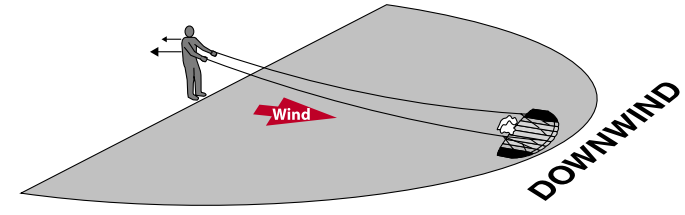
Do not throw the kite into the air.



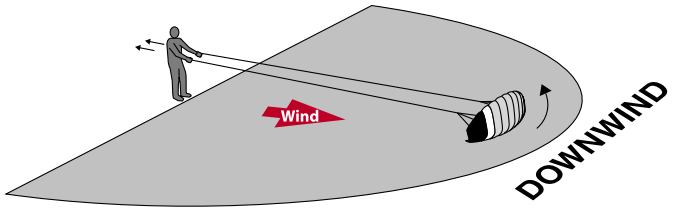
In light winds you may need to walk back. Look behind you for obstructions!

Solo Launch (for more experienced fliers)

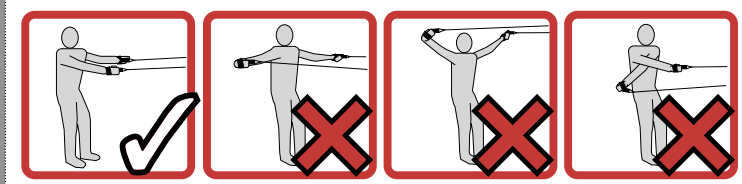
Secure the Buzz with a rucksack or sand etc. on the trailing edge (not on the bridle).



Take up the tension on both lines, gradually letting the Buzz inflate before pulling it gently to release it from the anchoring object.

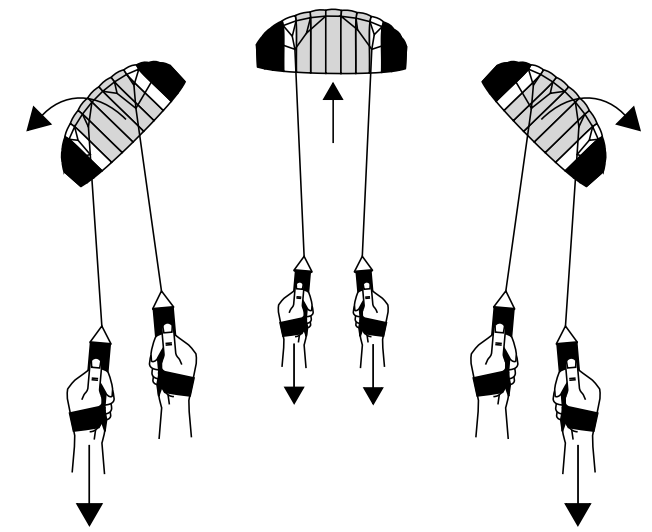


Correct Flying Position



Steering the Buzz

When learning, try to keep the Buzz near the top of the wind window (see earlier diagram) making gentle left and right turns.



When looping the Buzz, the lines will become twisted. The line is designed to withstand several loops before it becomes too tight to turn, but keep a count so that you can untwist them by looping the opposite way.
